

Notable Incident

At approximately 2:15am on August 8th, Mobile attended 1485 Douglas Street. We encountered individuals trespassing on private property. They were unresponsive and ignoring our directions. VicPD was contacted for assistance. The constable that responded stated that he had no power to move individuals off private property. He indicated that due to lack of signage, he was not able to remove the individuals. It should be noted that there are two Themis Security signs that state 'No Trespassing' within 6 feet of the individuals that were trespassing.

A third call to VicPD was placed at 8:00am, as the individuals were still on the property. Two VicPD constables did attend shortly after 9:00am and moved the trespassers off the property. Upon inquiring as to why they were able to deal with trespassers, the constable stated that it was at their discretion.

Upon further inquiry at VicPD station, we were informed that VicPD will not remove individuals off private property unless there is appropriate signage in order to limit their liability. The constable at the VicPD station gave us two signs and stated that she will have community resource officer contact us to clarify this situation.

Based on the current legislation, there is no requirement to post a sign on private property and notice can be given either verbally or in writing.

Training at Themis Security

Themis Security has been granted the license by the Justice Institute of BC to be an approved security training school for Basic Security Training (BST). BST is a 40 hour course that is required in order to be work for a security company.
